


Artificial Intelligence, the media, Europe and YOU!

At the heart of this extension of war lies a new battleground: information. 'Information warfare', the spread of fake news, conspiracy theories, and the distortion of facts to fit agendas: our profession stands on the front lines. We face the perilous task of telling the truth about these conflicts, often at great personal risk. We must verify information, help our fellow citizens distinguish fact from fiction, and advocate for media and information literacy, without which the corrosive forces of misinformation will only continue to thrive. The issues before us will demand our full mobilization during this second edition.

The program we've curated, in collaboration with all the partners who have helped make this European Agora for Journalism a reality, also dedicates considerable focus to the other pressing challenges of our time.

Chief among these is the environmental and climate emergency, and the responsibility of journalists and the media in covering these crises especially when such issues are often framed through an emotional lens. The recent catastrophic floods across Europe highlight the urgency of the situation, not to mention the migration crises they exacerbate.

Thank you all for taking time out of your busy schedules to join these crucial discussions and to enrich them with your insights, expertise, and personal experiences.

As part of its partnership with the European Union, Journalisme & Citoyenneté organization is implementing Sahafa Med project, which aims to foster dialogue with journalists from southern Mediterranean countries. Launched in 2021, this partnership regularly brings together journalists from Europe and the MENA region at the occasion of the Assises du journalisme and national meeting. On the sidelines of the 2nd edition of the European Agora for Journalism, Sahafa Med program brings together in Brussels more than fifty journalists and media development actors from MENA region and Europe to discuss media development issues in the region. This meeting is a continuation of the discussions that took place on February 16, 2024, at the Institut du Monde Arabe in Paris and the #SahafaMED study on the needs of journalists and media in the Southern Mediterranean countries, which was conducted in 2023.







THE 'IA: (R)EVOLUTION?' EXHIBITION

With CARTOONING FOR PEACE

The remarkable success of the ChatGPT conversational AI, launched in late 2022, introduced the public to a glimpse of the vast possibilities—and potential risks—offered by artificial intelligence (AI). As awareness grows of the need for a regulatory framework to guide AI development, questions about its ethical, legal, political, and economic implications are becoming ever more pressing. In short, these are questions about humanity itself, as AI increasingly disrupts all areas of our lives.

In this exhibition, Cartooning for Peace presents a collection of editorial cartoons from around the world, capturing the key issues surrounding the rise of artificial intelligence, all with a sharp sense of humor and... intelligence! The exhibition is based on

the book Intelligence artificielle: une (r)évolution?, published by Gallimard as part of the Cartooning for Peace series. The book features a foreword by Olivier Tesquet, a journalist at Télérama specializing in media and digital issues and is created in partnership with Amnesty International and France Médias Monde.

MEDIA LITERACY

As part of Media Literacy Week in Belgium, and in partnership with the Conseil Supérieur de l'Education aux Médias, the European Agora for Journalism has created a specific program for schools (in French), as a way to extend our approach to media literacy.

It is the first time the Agora organises it in Brussels, and we will be welcoming almost 300 young people to take part in a number of activities:

- > Setting up a mobile radio studio for two days to create a space for exchanges with journalism & media professionals and give them the chance to try their hand at creating sound content in real-life conditions.
- > Meeting journalists, media and press groups to discuss current and future issues in journalism with a media literacy approach.

INTERNATIONAL NEWSROOM FOR JOURNALISM SCHOOLS

Around fifty journalism students are covering the European Agora for Journalism in Brussels, producing content in French, English, and Arabic for the web and social media. They represent a variety of journalism schools, many of which are members of the Théophraste network of Frenchspeaking journalism schools, including: EPJT (Tours, France), ESSTIC (Yaoundé, Cameroon), FJSC (Bucharest, Romania), IHECS (Brussels, Belgium), IPSI (Tunis, Tunisia), and IUT de Cannes (Cannes, France). Additionally, about fifteen young journalists from Mediterranean countries, part of the EU Neighbours, have joined the team.

In parallel, as part of the Belgodyssée initiative, around twenty Belgian journalism students, both French-speaking and Dutch-speaking, will form a bilingual mobile journalism newsroom. This project is supported by the King Baudouin Foundation.
